## **2 CENSUS BUREAU DATA SOURCES**

#### Population Estimates Program

- > 2018 is most recently available data
- > 2019 data will be released in spring 2020
- Annual estimates of population changes by county, state, metro, and national since the last census & provides the reason for change (birth rate, death rate, in-migration, out-migration)
- "What is the population and how did it grow/shrink?"

#### Migration Flows

- Derived from the American Community Survey (ACS)
- ▶ 5-year estimates from survey data
- > 2013-2017 are most recent available data
- > Tracks flows between counties, states, metros, and place of birth
- "Where did people move to/from?"

### **TAX RETURN DATA**

- The IRS also tracks migration flows based on address changes from U.S. tax returns
- Most recently available data is the change from 2017-2018 tax years
- Published by state-to-state and county-to-county
- Only counts persons filing a U.S. tax return


### WHY DO PEOPLE MOVE?

Survey from Deloitte Consulting, 2019

- ▶ 90% of working adults search for a new job at least 1x per year
- 46% of survey respondents are "somewhat likely" or "extremely likely" to relocate for a new job in the next 5 years
- Top factors in a new opportunity: salary, work-life balance, and company benefits.
- Location of new job opportunity ranked #6 out of 10 in importance

#### TOP FACTORS IN LOCATION DECISIONS


