

BACKGROUND

- Over 18% of civilian workers in Alexandria and Arlington are employed by the federal government (<u>Richmond Fed</u>)
- We are not likely to have good data on the effects of federal workforce cuts for another few months
- The data included here is primarily for federal government workers; this does not account for reductions in employment due to federal contract/grant funding losses



% Change in Employment, Jan. 2025 to Mar. 2025






CHANGE IN JOB POSTINGS



POTENTIAL FUTURE IMPACTS

- If federal workforce was decreased by 75%, unemployment rate in DC metro area could rise to nearly 10% (<u>Urban Institute</u>)
- Other potential impacts:
 - Decrease in state and local tax revenues (Urban Institute)
 - Effects on other types of businesses (Washington Business Journal)
 - Migration out of the region
 - Regional recession
